OUR STORY

A villa that sails, drawn from the Naakolhu

For centuries the Maldives has been held together by the sea. Long before airports and resorts, handcrafted wooden boats known as Naakolhu carried families, traders and members of the royal court between the islands.

Historical records describe royal voyages across the atolls aboard traditional Maldivian fleets, reflecting how closely the monarchy and the ocean were bound together. Atoll Villa carries that philosophy one step further.

Instead of building a villa that looks like a boat, we built a luxury villa that sails.

Her lines follow the graceful curve of the traditional Naakolhu, joining generations of Maldivian boat-building with modern engineering and world-class hospitality. Designed as a Moving Villa, she lets guests wake to a different island each morning, find hidden lagoons and private sandbanks, and meet Maldivian culture on its own terms.

THE YACHT

Every deck drawn for stillness

Three decks, four suites, eight guests. Her hull follows the Naakolhu lines the Maldives has trusted for generations, adapted for shallow lagoons and long days at anchor.

Exterior

Drawn from the lines of the Naakolhu, the Maldivian working boat, and rebuilt in warm teak and pale composite. The shallow hull lets her lie inside lagoons that larger yachts can only look at from the channel.



4 SUITES · 8 GUESTS

Cabins

Four suites, each with panoramic glass at bed height, linen in warm white and sand, and blackout calm when you want the morning to wait. Wake to reef rather than a corridor.



CINEMA · LIBRARY

Indoor Lounge

A cool, shaded salon for the middle of the day: deep seating, a small library of Indian Ocean writing, and glass that frames the water without letting the heat in.



AFT DECK · SUNDECK

Outdoor Lounge

Shaded daybeds on the aft deck, open to the wake. This is where the day collects — wet towels, cold drinks, half-finished books and long conversations that outlast the light.

JACUZZI • MASSAGE SALA

Spa & Jacuzzi

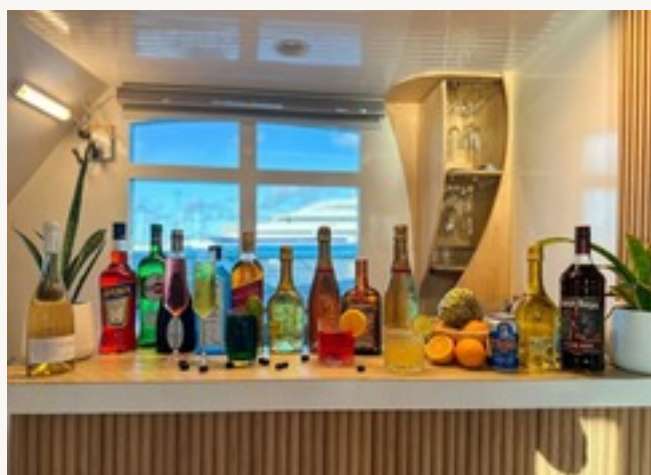
A sundeck jacuzzi set deliberately west, with a massage sala beside it and a therapist who reads the day before suggesting the treatment.



PRIVATE CHEF • BBQ DECK

Dining

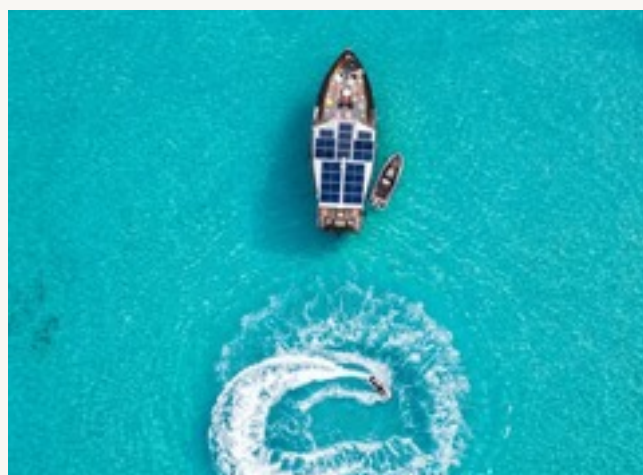
One chef, eight guests, no menu printed in advance. Maldivian reef fish, Japanese precision and Mediterranean simplicity, served wherever you happen to be sitting.



ATOLL VILLA BAR

Bar

Atoll Villa Bar is a stylish onboard lounge aboard a luxury yacht in the Maldives, offering a relaxed setting for sunset drinks, private celebrations, and evenings at sea. Enjoy refreshing beverages, comfortable seating, ocean views, and a refined atmosphere as part of your private Maldives yacht charter experience.



TENDER • JET SKI • DIVE KIT

Water Toys

Paddleboards, kayaks, a jet ski, a dive compressor and an eight-metre tender that turns any reef, break or village jetty into an afternoon.

ACCOMMODATION

Four suites, four kinds of morning

No two cabins aboard are alike. Choose by light, by height above the water, or by how quickly you want to reach the swim platform.

FULL BEAM • PRIVATE TERRACE WITH SPA JACUZZI

The Owner's Suite

Full beam on the upper deck, with glass on three sides and a bed placed so the reef is the first thing you register. Mornings arrive gradually here; blackout blinds hold them off as long as you like.

KING • BATH

The Ocean view cabin

Cooler and more sheltered, panelled in pale timber with a deep bath and a reading chair angled to the water. The suite guests keep returning to, usually without being able to say why.

KING OR TWIN

The Lagoon Suite

Low and close to the waterline, where the light moves across the ceiling all afternoon. Steps from the swim platform, which makes it the natural choice for anyone who spends the day wet.

TWIN • CONVERTIBLE

The Reef Suite

Twin beds that convert to a king, generous storage and a bathroom built for sandy feet. Designed with families and travelling friends in mind rather than as an afterthought.

LIVING SPACES

Eleven rooms without walls between them

Life aboard drifts between shade and sun all day. Each space was drawn for a particular hour.

- **Indoor Lounge**

Cool, shaded and deliberately dim at midday — deep seating, cold stone underfoot and glass that frames the water without the heat.

- **Jacuzzi**

Set west on the sundeck, warm as the air cools, positioned for the twenty minutes when the atoll turns to silhouette.

- **Sun Deck**

The highest and quietest space aboard. Yoga at sunrise, stargazing after dinner, nobody in between.

- **BBQ Area**

Coals lit on the aft deck as the sun drops — reef fish, lobster and vegetables from the morning's market run.

- **Massage Chair**

Tucked beside the sala for the hour after a dive, when nobody wants to talk and nobody has to.

- **Gaming Area**

Consoles, board games and cards — quietly essential on the third rainy afternoon of a family charter.

- **Outdoor Lounge**

The aft deck where the day collects: wet towels, cold drinks, half-read books and conversations that outlast the light.

- **Dining Area**

A single long table, moved indoors or out depending on the wind. Eight places, never more.

- **Bar**

Shaded and unhurried, stocked with cold champagne, island rum and fresh coconut — the crew pour, then leave you to the view.

- **Cinema**

A projection wall in the salon, blankets against the air conditioning, and a library of films for the crossing nights.

- **Library**

Indian Ocean writing, marine life guides and charts, shelved beside the window seat that catches the afternoon breeze.

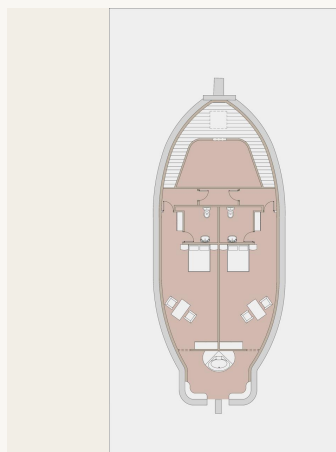


The shaded indoor lounge — cinema wall, library and deep seating for the middle of the day.

DECK PLANS

One deck, six ways

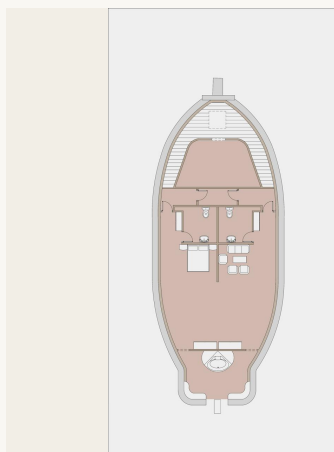
Atoll Villa is the first yacht built around fully convertible rooms. The same main deck is struck and reset by the crew in a few hours — sleeping, salon, retreat, cinema or event — so one vessel suits a family, a dive group, a board meeting or a wedding party.

Two Suites

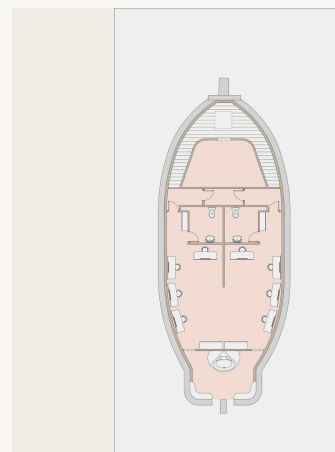
Two full double suites amidships, each en-suite, opening onto a shared aft lounge.

Suite & Salon

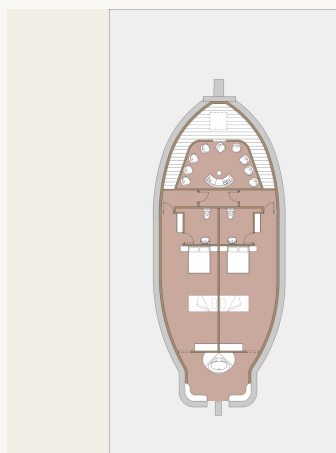
One suite stays made up; the second is reset as a salon with sofas and reading chairs.

Daybed Gathering

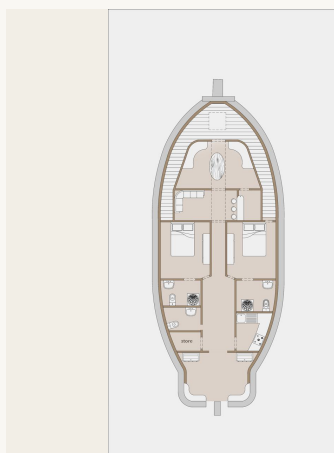
Beds removed, six daybeds along the hull sides and a clear central floor.

Cinema & Event

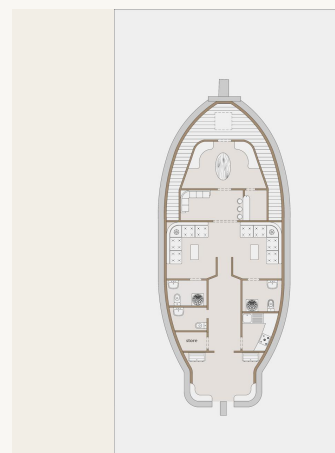
Tiered forward seating, curved bar and projection wall for screenings and briefings.



LOWER DECK

Lower Deck Cabins

Guest cabins, crew quarters and the day heads below the waterline.



LOWER DECK

Service & Expedition

Galley, stores, dive compressor, tank racks and the tender garage aft.

All six configurations use the same hull, the same four bathrooms and the same crew. Conversions are carried out on board between charters, or within a single day where a programme calls for it — no shipyard time, no change of vessel.

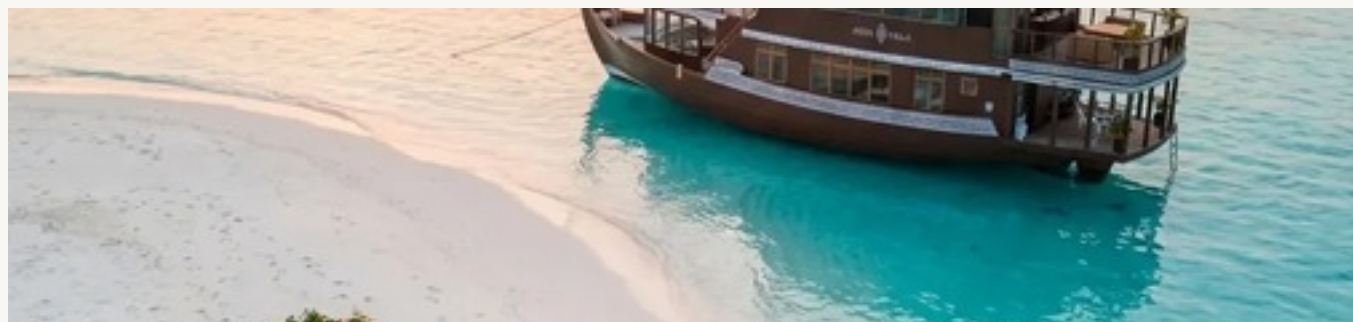

How the yacht is used

Each charter is drawn around its guests. These are the programmes brokers place most often.



Scuba Diving

Channels running with current, thilas stacked with soft coral, wrecks going quietly green. Tanks are filled onboard, so the ocean sets the schedule rather...

Snorkeling

Step off the platform into water so clear the reef looks closer than it is. Turtles graze, the coral shelves away, and lunch waits twenty metres behind you.

Sandbank Escape

A crescent of sand that exists for a few hours a day. Shade, ice, a table, and no other footprints — then the tide takes the whole thing back.

Sunset Cruise

Three hours of gold. The hull moves slowly, spinner dolphins arrive on cue, and the atoll turns to silhouette while glasses are refilled on the foredeck.

Family Charter

Four suites, a crew who learn every name by lunchtime, and a swim platform that becomes the centre of the day. Children set the pace; the yacht...

Wellness

Sunrise on the foredeck with nothing but water in every direction.

Treatments in the sala, quiet food, deep sleep and days measured by breath...

Solo restoration and small retreats



Fishing Adventure

Leave before the light, ride the channel edge and come back heavier. Whatever the reef gives up, the chef turns it into lunch on the aft deck.

Barefoot on a sandbank with eight people who matter. Vows over the sound of water, dinner on deck, and a first night already at anchor.

Distance from the office and a signal strong enough to ignore it. Sessions on the shaded aft deck, decisions made faster where nobody can knock on the...
